

Traditional reception classes

- Sheltered instruction classes within existing public primary and lower secondary schools
- Basic teaching of Danish as a second language + other age-relevant school subjects
- Small classes of up to 12(-18) pupils, spanning a maximum of 3(-5) school years
- Maximal duration of 2 years before full inclusion in regular classes

- Sheltered instruction classes within existing public primary and lower secondary schools
- Basic teaching of Danis other age-relevant

Ongoing project: Linguistic practices in and around reception classes

- Small-scale two-year project (2016-2017)
- Linguistic ethnograhy (Rampton 2007; Copland & Creese 2015; Snell, Copland & Shaw 2015) organised as multisited fieldwork in three different school settings
- Empirical material: Field notes, photos, video and audio recordings, interviews with pupils and teachers
- Critical sociolinguistic approach to language and multilingualism (Blackledge & Creese 2010; Blommaert 2010, Daugaard et al 2016)



The Danish Production Schools

Since 1978 the Danish production schools have developed into an independent school form attaining its own legislation in early 1985. The fundamental aim of this type of school was and continues to be: to create a practical learning environment that can qualify young people to complete general and vocational upper secondary education or maintain a normal job in the labour market. The students are offered the opportunity to develop professional, social and personal skills using counselling, participation in practical work and production in different workshops ranging from metal, carpentry and textiles to media, theatre and music workshops.



Reception classes 1 and 2

- Gender-integrated classes of 17-18 young people
- Aged 16-20
- Primarily from Syria and Eritrea, but also from Democratic Republic Congo, Egypt, Marocco, Poland, Vietnam, Thailand and Turkey
