Business matters:

Over the past year, ISfTE Executive Board members have continued to meet electronically to address ISfTE matters. You will see a number of changes and initiatives as we move into the coming year. I am excited to announce that Leanne Taylor, in her new role as Editor of JISTE and with the support of JISTE Editorial Board members, is forging ahead with plans to convert our journal to an open-access format. Please read about this important shift in Leanne's JISTE Update (pgs. 3–5). I want to thank Leanne for her hard work and Editorial Board members for their contributions to getting this exciting initiative in place.

Jackie Chan will be stepping down as our Communications Manager this year and Katarina Pantic from Weber State will be our new Communications Manager. Jackie and Katarina have been working together to ensure a smooth transition into the new year. Jackie provides the Communication Manager update in this newsletter (pg. 6). I want to thank Jackie on behalf of all members for his dedication and hard work over the past 7 years.

Early in the new year, we will hold elections for Member-at-Large positions that are open for 3-year terms beginning June 2022. Only ISfTE members are eligible to run or vote for these positions. Please check to ensure you have kept your membership fees up to date. Everyone who attended ISfTE 2019 in Niagara Falls, Canada are paid members. Membership fees for 2019-2020 were included with the 2019 registration. All other people need to submit their fees to maintain their membership. Please give serious consideration to running for a position. We need members to contribute to the work of our Society through membership on the Executive Board. If you are not available at this time, nudge another member that you know to run for a position. You will receive information and directions for casting your votes early in the new year.

At our Annual General meeting in Brazil, we will welcome our newly elected board members and our new Secretary-General, Sheryl Rushton who will move from her position as Secretary-General Elect to Secretary General (2022–2025).

An invitation was recently sent out to remind members to submit their abstracts and start making plans to attend ISfTE 2022 in Brazil. Please let your colleagues know about the conference and encourage them to visit the ISfTE 2022 website to learn more (https://isfte2022.eventize.com.br/index.php?language=en). Although COVID continues to influence what is happening around the world, we remain hopeful that May will be a time when we can meet again face-to-face to present, discuss and celebrate our work as educators and educational researchers. It is my pleasure to write my first report as Editor of JISTE. On behalf of the Editorial Board, I would like to begin by expressing my heartfelt gratitude to Karen Bjerg Petersen for her tremendous work and for all she has done to support the journal and the Society. As many of us know, Karen was Editor of JISTE for more than ten years. During this time, she has been a dedicated, committed, reliable and generous mentor and leader in our Society. Throughout her tenure as Editor, Karen advanced JISTE's reputation as an international journal and ensured JISTE continued to be a meaningful forum for dialogue about teacher education in an international context. I am honored to continue this work and to follow Karen's good guidance moving forward. Thank you, Karen!

The success of JISTE is also dependent on our Editorial Board as well as our team of Associate Editors. I am grateful to DeeDee Mower and David Byrd at Weber State University. Their hard work and commitment are a key part of JISTE's success. Both are working diligently to complete the final English editing for issue 25.2, which is scheduled to be published by the end of December 2021.

The success of JISTE, which publishes two issues per year, depends on the hard work of a group of dedicated volunteers. We are fortunate to have such a strong voluntary base who generously donate their time, expertise, and knowledge to JISTE.

<u>Updates</u>

The JISTE Editorial Board held its annual meeting on June 9, 2021. Karen Bjerg Petersen chaired the meeting, which was held online. Although the Editorial Board typically meets in person at the ISfTE Seminar, we once again moved online due to the cancellation of the 2021 Seminar in Bhutan.

At this meeting, the Board agreed to bring forward to the ISfTE Executive Board a proposal to move JISTE to an open access format. Over the past several years, our ISfTE membership has requested that JISTE explore the possibility to move to open access in recognition that open and free availability of scientific research for everyone has become an important global issue. Norway and much of Europe, for example, have implemented ambitious policies on open access for the past decade. Many other countries have moved or are moving to an open access format. The Editorial Board agreed that moving JISTE to open access would allow more ISfTE members the opportunity to submit articles to JISTE, which would in turn increase readership and citations and expand participation in ISfTE (i.e., generate new members).

I am pleased to announce that the ISfTE Executive Board has approved our request to move JISTE to an open access format. We are now in the process of finalizing JISTE's Open Access site.

Once the site is available, all submissions, reviewer evaluation forms, and journal correspondence will be completed through the secure online site. This shift simplifies the process for editors, reviewers, authors, and readers. The site will be straightforward to navigate. Detailed user instructions will be provided to all members.

The website will launch in early 2022. The site will be available to receive JISTE manuscript submissions in February for publication in JISTE 26.1.


