#### Introduction

The Bhutan 2023 Annual ISfTE Seminar, which was held from 11–16 June 2023, was co-hosted by Paro College of Education, Royal University of Bhutan and the Academy of Himalayan Art and Child Development at the Paro College of Education campus. A total of 90 delegates from more than fifteen countries participated along with six accompanying persons. The theme of this year's seminar was – Transformative education post Covid–19 pandemic: From self–healing to social transformation. This was the second ISfTE seminar hosted in Bhutan, first being held in 2012.

#### **Participants**

#### REPORT ON THE BHUTAN 2023 ANNUAL SEMINAR

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#### **Seminar Organization**

The seminar began with an opening ceremony on the first day, which was graced by the Honourable Secretary of the Ministry of Education and Skills Development, Bhutan and the Vice Chancellor of the Royal University of Bhutan. As a part of the opening ceremony, an International book on 'Happiness Education: Holistic learning for sustainable learning' edited by Gerald W. Fry and Haelim Chun was launched. The College students performed a variety of cultural programmes while the guests and the delegates enjoyed the welcome dinner.

The seminar had three interesting Keynote addresses by different speakers that included Professor Thakur S. Powdyel, former Minister of Education (To teach is to heal!), Dr Craig Elevitch from Haiwai, USA (Regenerative Education) and Aum Jamyang Dolma from Haiwai (How to awaken the power of nourishment!). One interesting feature of this year's ISfTE seminar was the inclusion of a total of four panel discussions: From Self-Healing to Social Transformation; Himalayan Art in Education/Mindful Art; Biodiversity and Cultural Diversity in Education; and Transformative Parenting Practice for Future Generations. Each panel had four to eight members who responded to a variety of questions asked by the moderators. Another unique feature was the hour-long workshop on 'Embodied sonic meditation' offered by Jiayue Cecilia Wu from the University of Colorado.

The delegates were divided into six thematic paper groups- STEM Education; Technology/Blended Learning; Wellbeing/Non Cognitive Skills; Teacher Education; Curriculum/Pedagogy; and Educational Leadership/Assessment/Inclusive Education in which the delegates shared their papers inviting constructive feedbacks. The paper groups were the highlight of the seminar and most delegates shared their satisfaction being a part of the paper group. Apart from the academic discourse, the delegates had opportunities to take a day's hike to Taktshang monastery (Tiger's nest) and visit a few schools and important places such as the National Museum of Bhutan in Paro, National Institute of Zorig Chusum, VAST Bhutan, Buddha Point, Craft Bazaar to experience the culture and tradition of Bhutan.

On the final day, the Annual General Meeting of the ISfTE was convened followed by sharing of the plans for ISfTE 2024 by the conveners from the Weber State University in USA and concluded with the interesting paper group presentations. The seminar was officially closed with a closing dinner where each delegate had an opportunity to participate in circle time-sharing. Most delegates wanted to sow a seed of gratitude, care, compassion, joy, empathy, honesty, volunteerism, etc. A cultural programme was performed by the Royal Academy of Performing Arts.

#### Feedback of the Seminar

In general, the feedback on the conduct of the Bhutan 2023 Annual ISfTE Seminar was good except for few comments to improve on the future conduct of the seminar (detailed report on the feedback will be shared later).

#### Conclusion

On the whole, the Bhutan 2023 Annual ISfTE Seminar was a great success. It was indeed an immense achievement for the Paro College of Education. Almost all the delegates expressed their satisfaction. We look forward hosting a similar one in the near future with better organizational skills and vigor.

The Annual Seminar will be held in **Utah**, USA from **29 April to 3 May, 2024**. Known as the Crossroads of the West for gathering and connection, Utah is also home to the "greatest snow on earth", unique natural park scenery, the Tabernacle Choir at Temple Square, and the Great Salt Lake. The state symbol is the beehive for its hardworking people and productive past. USA is known for independence and welcoming of people around the world.

Weber State University is honored to welcome ISfTE again to its beautiful campus nestled next to the Rocky Mountains near the shores of the Great Salt Lake. WSU was established in 1889 and is nationally ranked. Approximately 30,000 students attend WSU. Teacher Education is in the top 10 degree programs at WSU. The university campus elevation is at 1437 meters or 4715 feet. Average temperatures during the seminar are comfortable to cool ranging between highs of 65°F (18° C) to 75° F (24° C) to lows around 45°F (7° C). Recognizing the value of the natural beauty surrounding the area and the emphasis Weber State University places on sustainability, the 2024 Seminar strives to be an environmental green experience. Meetings will be held in sustainable carbon neutral capable spaces, attendees will travel via public transportation during seminar events, and technology will be used to reduce paper waste.

Those attending the seminar will enjoy time with colleagues from around the world reading papers, having enlightening conversations, and hearing from keynote speakers. As in past seminars, the convening country will provide excursions to learn more about their country. These excursions are included in the price of the seminar. This year tentative planned excursions include visits to three different types of public schools (traditional elementary, innovative secondary, and digital university), three museums (historical, religious, and genealogical), local tours, and performances (choir and cultural). All meals are included and planned to be representative of the food in Utah's past and present. In addition to the Seminar Program, attendees could have the option to add an extended tour at an additional cost to southern Utah Natural Parks (i.e. Zion) and Las Vegas, Nevada through an independent Utah Travel Company.

## COMMUNICATION MANAGER UPDATE

As mentioned in the previous newsletter, the website got migrated to a Bluehost server located in the US. Since the migration has been finalized, everything has been running smoothly and the costs have been reduced. Without any increases in prices, we expect the annual cost for privacy, domain, hosting, security and maintenance to be less than or close to 400 US dollars in the next few years, which is a meaningful decrease for our non-profit.

With the changes that we introduced last year, when we added both an Instagram and a LinkedIn account to our existing communication effort, our traffic has increased a bit. We posted 23 times on Facebook, 12 times on Instagram, sent 9 email announcements, six posts on LinkedIn and seven times on the website. Regular posting on Facebook during the seminar in Brazil alone increased our "views" four times. If you have any suggestions on how to improve communication, please let us know.

The newly integrated Google Analytics allowed us to add nuance to our understanding of website visitors. This is how we learned that we had 1814 unique users of the site in the past year, 164 of which were returning users (or regular). Most visitors (844) were from the US, followed by visitors from China, Norway, Bhutan, Canada, Australia, India, Philippines, Brazil and Hong Kong. We currently have 1013 followers on Facebook, 60 on Instagram, and 32 on LinkedIn.


