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The Utah ISFTE Organizing Team sends greetings! During ISFTE 2024, 47 delegates from around the world convened at Weber State University in Ogden, Utah, USA from 29 April to 4 May 2024.

The **Crossroads of Education and Innovation** were highlighted during both academic, cultural, and social components of the seminar. The majority of the seminar academic time was spent in constructive reading, feedback and support. The seminar's culture events included tours to history and genealogy museums, choir programs, and Native American performances. The seminar highlighted visits to innovative elementary and secondary schools.
